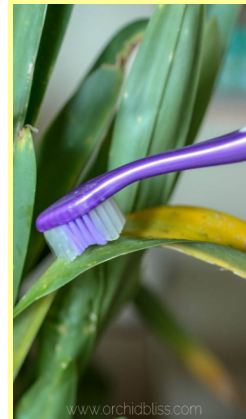

Grow Comp. plants can be brought in for judging, each month. They go on the table under the projector screen—write your **NAME** on the paper provided and place under your plant, ready for judging.

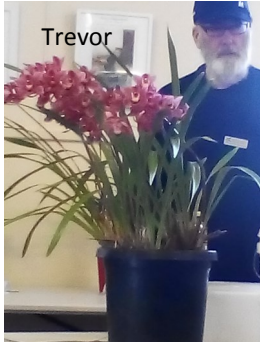

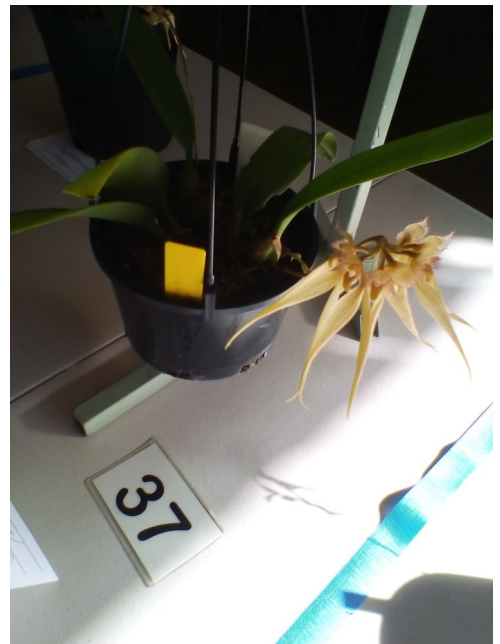

NOVICE CORNER BY A.M. & J.C.

This month we are looking at **Phaius orchids**



GROW Orchids
TIPS FOR BEGINNERS



Phaius, commonly known as **swamp orchids** is a genus of forty five species of flowering plants in the orchid family, Orchidaceae. They are evergreen, terrestrial herbs which form clumps with crowded, sometimes stem-like pseudobulbs, large, pleated leaves and relatively large, often colourful flowers. Species in this genus are found in the tropical parts of Africa, Asia, Southeast Asia, New Guinea, Australia, and various islands of the Pacific and Indian Oceans.^[1] One species is also naturalized in Hawaii, Florida, and the Caribbean.



How to care for these unusual orchids was asked and here are some sound advice on how to do it.



I grow my Phaius in a mix of Orchiatea 9-12mm a little quality potting mix and some Charcoal and Blue metal stone. I sit them in a tray with a little water in the base over Summer. It helps keep them humid and that way we do not have spider mite either. They are fertilized the same as everything else - low N high K , twice a week—October to June then Seasol Seaweed till October watered either once a week or every ten days in Winter. Keep an eye out for Mealey bug as Phaius and Calanthe are Mealy bug magnets. B.

They grow native around here in sandy coastal soils that get boggy in the wet season (Oct - March). I live near the Cooloola Coast, Qld. I have quite a few in pots. Potted in Searles potting mix with saucers underneath to hold water. Take the saucers away in winter but keep watering. Keep out of wind. Temperatures are down to 0 degrees but not below at the moment. Light shade is all they need here. Humidity is pretty low at the moment but high in summer.

use an orchid slow release. L.S.

I use the cymbidium mix from Bunnings for my phaius, spathoglottis types as it is rough. I add sand, leaf mould from my rainforest and a bit of charcoal. They live under my bench and kept moist. Seem to do okay. E. S.

I have one and so far it is doing well [fingers crossed] . A.M.

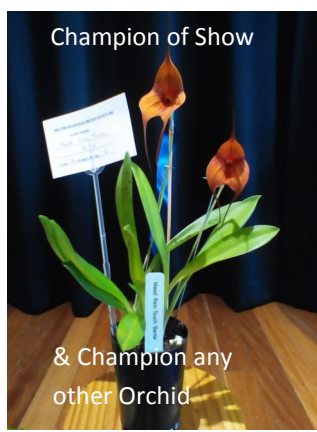

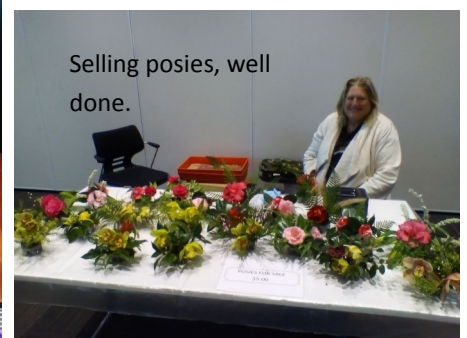
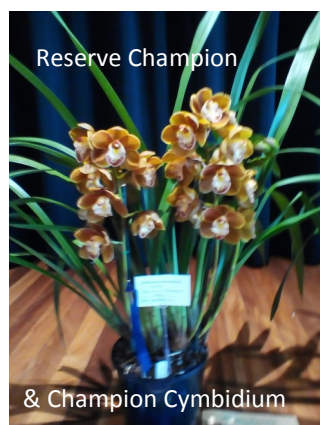
