## Verdigris Fern Nursery Visit.

The visit to the fern nursery on the 6th March was awesome and many ferns were bought plus a begonia or few, were re-homed. If you get a chance to go to Verdigris Fern Nursery—GO!! Excellent ferns for sale at very cheap prices, all very unusual. We saw all parts of the process from spores to parent plant propagation. Thank you to Kylie for having us and to Batemans Bay Orchid & Foliage Society for inviting us to join them. :) A.M. :)



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Our speaker this month was **Ron Boyd**, who gave an interesting talk, with a slide show, on Paphiopedilum culture.



## Paphiopedilum Culture, especially Exhibition type Paphiopedilums

They will grow and flower well under the following conditions.

**TEMPERATURE:** Minimum of 8 to 10 degrees Celsius to a maximum of 30+ degrees Celsius.

LIGHT: 70% shade cloth for all of my Paphiopedilums

## HUMIDITY: around 70% would be ideal if possible

**POTTING MIX**: I use Ausgro composted bark, ½ inch for seedlings in compots and ½ inch (small bark) for my 48mm square tubes, also in 3 inch pots, 15 mls or medium grade for 80 mm &100 mm pots and larger.

Orchiata bark from NZ come bone dry for quarantine reasons and needs to be soaked in water for a few days with a cup full of "Amgrow Soil Wetter" before use (available from Bunnings)

WATER: Quality of the water is critical. (I use rain water when ever I can and put it down to about 180% of my success in growing quality plants) If you are using water from town, they usually have a high pH Batemans Bay, water usually is about 7to 8 Ph. All these factors will affect the uptake of fertilizer and the production of a good root system. Plants should be kept nearly moist at all times, in spring, summer and early autumn, and in Winter I only mist the leaves on warm sunny days and water once a week or so.

## A good potting mix and good air movement and good drainage holes in the pots are a must.

**FERTILIZER**: In spring I use "Organic Life pellets made by Terra Firma" Check out their web page information. http://tff.com.au/images/

product\_information\_guides/terrafirma\_product\_info\_organic\_life.pdf This I place around the top of the potting mix and just covering with a light layer of bark, about 6 pellets per 80mm pot. Then a teaspoon of pelleted lime around the top of the pot and water in, this I now redo about every 4 to 5 weeks to keep the potting mix sweet.

A special Paphiopedilum blended fertilizer produced by Horticultural Solutions of Qld. Horticultural solutions PO Box 213 Capalaba Q 4157 32060037 (Wolfgang) Called Paphiopedilum Green N12 P5 K 25%

Plus lots of trace elements. I mix at about half chemical supplied teaspoon per 10 litres of water and gives a TDS reading about 150PPM+ . I use this about every 2<sup>nd</sup> or third watering during the growing season.

Campbell's Fertilisers—Diamond Special T 8-3.9-32.5+1.8Mg with micro

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nutrients, is a water soluble one.

Another product I use about every month is GoGo Juice, (available from Bunnings) about capful per 10 litres of water and pour over the potting mix as a general watering, This supplies microbes etc. to the mix that helps break down the chemical fertilizer so it become more available to the plants roots system

**DEFLASKING:** When deflasking seedling or repotting Paphiopedilums I use a weak dose of Plant Starter to kick start the new roots, great product available at Bunnings as well

TIPS FOR BEGINNERS

## NOVICE CORNER BY A.M. & J.C.

Believe it or not, the contents of your medicine cabinet or pantry can be used to help maintain healthy orchids. That's because many herbal remedies have natural anti-fungal or anti-bacterial properties that can help protect against many orchid diseases.

# 1. Cinnamon

Not only does it taste and smell good, cinnamon is a natural fungicide, which makes it useful for protecting your orchid plant from fungus and bacteria.

**How to Use It:** After you have trimmed your orchid's leaves, stem or roots, sprinkle a little dusting of cinnamon over the areas. You can sprinkle the seasoning over the area you'd like treated or dip the area directly into some cinnamon. Just make sure the areas you're sprinkling have been moistened to help the powder stick.

# 2. Isopropyl Alcohol

This common household staple is good for sterilizing things or cleaning wounds and it can help rid your plant of mealybugs. These little white creatures can infest your orchid, hatching and hiding in tiny nooks and crannies, leaving behind a sticky substance and chewing

through your plant. Often horticultural oil or insecticidal soaps are recommended to treat a mealybug infestation, but if you don't have any on hand, try isopropyl alcohol. **How to Use it:** Dip your fingers, a cotton ball or a cotton swab in the alcohol and remove any mealybugs you see. Continue treatment by spraying the alcohol on the plant and removing any more hatched mealybugs that look like little yellow spots. To make sure you've gotten all the pests, pay particular attention to any crevices, folds or lips on your plant or pot.
