If a species is crossed with another clone of the same species, the offspring remains a species.

Eg;- Den. speciosum var. capricornicum "Big Boy" x Den. speciosum var. curvicaule(Remains a Den. speciosum)

L. purpurata v. Carnea "Delicata" x L. purpurata roxo v.Vivideta "Arunda" (remains L. purpurata)

ORCHID SPECIES THAT NEED A REST DURING COLDER MONTHS.

Barkeria must be kept dry during Winter

Beallara. Don't let them dry out during warmer months. Water sparingly during Winter.

Bifrenaria Best moved into full sun in winter. Keep dry until flower spikes appear than give a it a big feed and a hand full of dolomite.

Bletilla are deciduous and need a Winter rest.

Calanthes are also deciduous and semi deciduous so need a Winter rest.

Castasetinae: Catasetum, cycnoches, Mormodes, Clowesia and Galeandra—Winter rest.

Coelogyne Reduce watering during Winter to encourage good flower and growth.

Cymbidium canaliculatum. Withhold watering during colder months in Winter.

Cymbidium iridioides. Reduce watering during Winter months.

Dendrobium anosmum, aphullum, crepidatum, pulchellum, regium, monofiliforme. These are wholly or partly deciduous.

Dendrobium bigibbum – essential watering rest during Winter.

Dendrobium densiflorum, farmeri, fimbriatum, linnleyi (aggregatum). A watering rest period during cool months is needed for growth and flowering.

Dendrobium chrysotoxam need a short rest in Winter.

Dendrobium loddigesii – Must have a watering rest period during late Autumn and Winter to flower well.

Dendrobium moschatum A watering rest period is required from late Autumn to early Spring.

Dendrobium nobile. Must be kept dry over Winter and Spring until new growth emerges.

Dendrobium pierardii. Is deciduous and needs a dry Winter to flower well.

Dendrobium softcanes. Like a rest during Autumn and Winter. Mist them when you feel they need it. Fertilise with Campbell's Yellow (3g per litre of water for very mature plants) towards end of October. New growth starts from Spring to Summer.

Dendrobium thyrisflorum – Needs a watering rest period during Winter and early Spring.

Lycaste are either deciduous or semi-deciduous & need a rest.

Miltonia (related to Odonts) Rest period after flowering in Winter.

Pleione are deciduous and need a rest.

Psychopsis papilio water every two weeks, occasional misting in Winter.

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Zygopetalum less water, do not dry out completely.

Some tips -

Phil Smith

—I noticed a keiki developing on one of the old spikes on a Tolumnia urophylla and then noticed another on another piece of it I took off and mounted up in the spring.

I have just mounted them onto a piece of cork but left them attached to the mother plant until they are established.

So 1 became 2 and 2 became 4.

These were later put onto a wire frame with the smaller plants above the 'parent' plant—no strain on the connections.

---When growing orchids it is important to get yourself into a routine.

Select your watering/fertilizing etc days.

Allocate a day each month to weed.

Have a regular fungicide/insecticide programme rather than wait for trouble to occur. Sanitize and remove algae from your Orchid house and clean up dead leaf fall on a regular basis.

Repotting can be done at almost any time where necessary if you live in warmer

climates. And if a plant is sick attend to it straight away rather than leave it to deteriorate over Winter.

A monthly planner is not a bad way to go if you don't have a good memory. Laminate a planner sheet and use a white board marker.

-Cymbidium growers -. Stakes are in position already. This tells me what's in spike. Spray for scale. As buds are still protected in sheath risk of damage low.

Start slug and snail baiting programme. No pity if your spikes get eaten coz you forgot.

Remove old dry leaf bases, you will be surprised what hides under them.

Have a dry hard roof cover to protect blooms. Shadiest areas for green, yellows and whites. High light for red, pinks and browns.

Know your plants flowering habit. Hang pendulous varieties. Tie arching varieties once below first flower buds. Train uprights. Feed them high potash bloom booster feeds. It wont increase bud count but can improve size and colour.

Remove weeds.Keep evenly moist.Make sure plants are well spaced.Trim leaf tip die back.That's the start, keep going until they are ready to show or show off.[So much to learn, more to do. :)A.M.]

All novices need help.
