NOVICE CORNER BY A.M. & J.C.







This month we are looking at CYMBIDIUMS. Cymbidiums are among the oldest horticultural orchids in the world. They were mentioned in a manuscript from the Chin dynasty in China, about 200 years before Christ and even Confucius mentions them, calling them the king of

fragrant flowers.


Cymbidiums are among the most popular orchid genus.

They're an important cut flower crop for florists and are widely cultivated as an orchidist's fancy.

Orchid spikes usually stay in flower about six or seven weeks if left on the plant, and if cut for a vase it's generally the same deal. It is possible to cut them in bud, but it's better to wait until they're in flower. "If you cut them in bud it can send them backwards and they won't open, and you will just end up with

a vase full of buds.

They need good light. They also need good, even watering so they are not too wet, and won't dry out. They also need potting on. Use a large particle size bark. It allows air to get in around the roots. When repotting don't tease out the roots of the orchid just



into the larger pot space you will get more dramatic, big bloomed plants. It usually takes at least two or three seasons before it's time to re-pot into the next sized container.

Use a slow release fertiliser once a year. Orchids also like a little dolomite lime. During spring and early summer supplement this with some liquid fertiliser as a top up during the growth period.
