

# NOVICE CORNER BY A.M. & J.C.

January 9th, 2021. Colin Noy wrote a worrying article on Facebook. Michelle and I, both thought it was most interesting. We asked and with his permission, it is here for everyone to read. A.M.

Today's discovery. A Dendrobium speciosum with two shrivelled new growths. I must have missed it in the garden when I sprayed for pests last week. First thought was evening rain this week had rotted the growths. On closer inspection I found a small white styrofoam-like cluster at the base of one of the shrivelled growths. Dreaded Dendrobium beetles. I lifted the plant out of the pot to reveal two, then three then four and finally 5 cocoons. When I lifted the plant fully out of the pot I found two more at the very bottom of the mix. It goes to show that if one finds and eliminates cocoons at the top of the pot, there may be more hidden beneath. The only thing to do, apart from soaking the whole plant in a bucket of pesticide mix, is to repot the plant to ensure I get the lot. There may be more cocoons in the middle of the mix. I have several D. speciosums outside my main orchid house. These are like the roses at the end of the grape vines that forewarn of disease. The beetles go for the speciosums first. Here are some photos of the cocoons. I have been collecting cocoons and hatching them in a sealed plastic container to get some photos of the hatchlings.



I have cut off the two damaged growths. As they are the leads, they can inhibit other eyes this season. It is like apical dominance. By cutting them off, I hope that another eye on each cane will develop this year. I sliced open one of the damaged growths to show that the larvae eats the whole centre out of the cane and then burrows out when mature to find a place to pupate.

# **TIPS for January/February/March** [Summer into Autumn].

At this time of year we need to keep a look out for scale, aphids and fungi. The weather has been warm, humid and plenty of rain. These are all necessary factors that encourage both insects and fungus to grow. Check your leaves , both on top and underneath—they can be very sneaky.

Potting should be well underway but remember to allow for the heat and place the newly potted orchids in the best possible places.

Sarcs, that need to be potted on, should be looked at now—which pots do you need? Have you enough bark—at the needed sizes? Are you adding slow release fertiliser? Then be ready for March—to pot them on as they are or to divide. They do look spectacular as a specimen size plant.
