NOVICE CORNER

helpful hints for novice growers.

CYMBIDIUMS

Clearly the most recognisable orchid to the public and one that most novices start with. Dendrobiums, in some ways, would be a better first choice, as they flower quicker and on a smaller plant, [not specio-sums].

Cymbidiums can be found in most parts of the world, even in Australia we have native cymbidiums. This time I am looking at the more exotic ones, which in some cases have been crossed with our native cyms.

In our society we have many good cym. Growers, but we also have a couple who are Australian known for their cultivation, propagation and showing of their cymbidiums.

Liz Cleaver and Tony Groube, a dynamic duo, clearly know what they are doing, all pictures on this page

are some of their currently flowering cyms. Cym. Plush Canyon 'Queen of Hearts'

Cymbidiums need :-

ENVIRONMENT—Cymbidiums appreciate a protected position away from strong hot sun, heavy winds and direct frost. The perfect environment should be **warm, airy and bright** and preferably off the ground. Northern facing verandas and patios are excellent if they are covered.





Cym. Mad Irishman 'Juan Diaz'

With a little TLC, you will be romanced by cymbidium orchid's elegant flowers for 4 to 12 weeks **between winter and spring**.

REPOTTING—Cymbidium orchids should be **repotted in a course mix** every two years or once the potting medium remains soggy and no longer drains properly.

You will want to repot during the spring after the orchids flowers have bloomed. Before repotting, you should trim away the damaged roots with a sterile cutting tool.

WATERING—Water your cymbidium **once a week all year if needed**, using rainwater or filtered tap water.

FERTILISING -From autumn to spring feed fortnightly, and every week during spring and summer, using a balanced liquid feed at quarter to half strength.

PROPOGATION— There are a few ways to increase your cymbidium numbers, my favourite is buying them from reputable sellers. You can divide larger ones when repotting and could exchange for variety, with other members you trust or you can pollinate your own plant and send the seed pods away for



laboratory flasking.




