
Some minor amendments have been made to the 2022 Programme, so please adjust your diaries.



# **NOVICE CORNER**

# helpful hints for novice growers.

## MOUNTING A DOCKRILLIA with John Clancy.

February meeting saw our first Novice Corner event. John showed us many different kinds of mounts cork, untreated wood, fern and other products. A good source he recommended for mounts was The Hanging Garden [picture of their card included].













He started off with a plant in a pot, which he removed all media from. He then picked a mount that the plant could attach to and still have room to grow and spread on it. The plant was positioned up against the mount and moss placed over its roots. This will help increase the humidity and retain moisture.

The plant was tied to the mount with fishing line but the moss protected the roots from it. Once the plant's

roots have embraced the mount, the line may not be needed. It was discussed that having a helper to hold things in place, was a good idea and Anne Moody helped John with this. The resulting mounted plant looked secure and ready to continue its life. While waiting for the plant to develop, John suggested to leave the plant horizontal in the raft position. He said once established, to hang it in a suitable spot in your orchid house. This was very interesting and a practical display for Novices. Thank you, John.





Lynne Phelan then gave us a quick demonstration on how she mounted small orchids, with string [ which, in time, would disintegrate] and handed out to us lucky Novices, some keikis of Dendrobium loddigesii. She said—do not water between Easter and Fathers Day—to only mist the plants. If they are watered too much they produce keikis and not flowers. Thank you, Lynne.

IN YOUR ORCHID HOUSE- March — check for mealy bugs and fungus. The weather has been hot and humid and this encourages both, plus many kinds of unwanted insects. Look for cymbidium spikes coming up on your early flowering ones. You should be reducing watering, as the temperatures are decreasing. A.M.
