NOVICE CORNER

helpful hints for novice growers.

Cattleya purpurata

Cattleya purpurata is a stunning orchid and with a bit of effort, will give you an outstanding display. The pictures on this page have come from Lynne & Brian Phelan. These two open growers, would be an excellent source of information—on how to grow these interesting orchids, on our South Coast.

Cattleya purpurata, known in the past as **Laelia purpurata** and **Sophronitis purpurata**, is native to Brazil where it is very popular among orchid growers.

It is an <u>epiphyte</u> that is found in the canopy of tall trees near coastal areas, in the Brazilian states of <u>Rio Grande do Sul, Santa Catarina</u> and <u>São Paulo</u>.

The orchid favours bright light and cool to warm conditions and is relative easy to cultivate.

C. purpurata has been used extensively as a parent in hybridizing with <u>Cattleyas</u>.

Cattleya purpurata blooms from late spring to autumn, with three to five flowers on a spike.

The flowers are long-lasting and fragrant.

Laelia purpurata should be **watered frequently**, especially during active growth, but before the next watering, the roots should be slightly dried. The amount of water can be slightly reduced over time and just after flowering, but the plants can never be dry for a longer period of time.





Laelia purpurata are not shy in producing their giant [4-6 inch] 15cm blooms. Every new cane throws 3-6 giant high colour blooms on strong racemes.

The large buds appear from the papery protective sheaths around mid-December and are at their finest for Christmas day and the New Year holiday season
