Paphs. For beginners.

June meeting speaker, Jane Wright, talked to us about Paphiopedilums for beginners.

These "slippers" have always been just a little bit too hard, but after her talk, I felt I was better able to look after them [I hope].

She pointed out the parentage of the modern slippers and how the crosses were developed. Her slide show, gave us visual representation of the results of putting specific orchids together to develop certain aspects—such as shape, size, colouration, markings and curvature.

Each parent gives some of its "looks" to the child.

This 1st generation cross has gone on to influence present day paphs.

Jane then went onto give us a wide range of paph. types. She also spoke about what a judge looks for in paphs—on the bench.

What is a good Maudiae paph. from the judging point of view?

Petals— even, without furling, held symmetrically to produce a balanced effect when viewed from any angle.

Dorsal—large, wide and flat, free of furling and twisting.

Lip—held vertically, in proportion to the rest of the flower and not projecting forward excessively.

Colour—clear and even.

Stems—long and straight.

To ensure your flower looks its best - 1] once a bud has initiated,

turn the plant around to face the light and don't move it. 2] when the bud is close to opening, tip the pot forward slightly, so that once the flower has opened and set, it will face slightly upwards when the pot is flat [the flower will look at you, not downwards]. 3] if staking is needed, stake below [not on] the ovary.

Good reasons to grow them— plants are relatively small, leaves can be beautiful [especially Maudiae paphs], the flowers are very long lasting [up to 3 months] and good subjects for growing in the home.
