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Novice Talk Part 1 by Michelle McIntosh

1 Ask lots of questions. It doesn't matter if you think it is silly, as most growers are more than happy to help you

Visit growers in their own backyards, as you can learn more in a 2-hour visit to see somebody's set up than you can at meetings. Try to go to the roving days as they are a great social day. The committee members are very busy on meeting days, they can't always find the time to meet and greet new members. We are working on setting up new members with a buddy to show them what goes on at meetings.

- Buy the right type of ingredients for your plant mix, as this is one of the most important things when growing orchids. Make sure that you soak the mix for a day or more before you use it. Don't buy Bunnings Orchid mix. It is only fit for the compost bin.
- 4 You can use any type of fertilizer, and use more than one brand.
- 5 Mount versus pots, mounts need to be watered every day in summer, and every second or third day in Winter.
- 6 Face your orchids to the North if you can, for max sun.
- Place tubs of water under your benches to help with humidity, as Orchids need it to grow well.Also hang some old man's beard moss around, as this also helps with humidity.
- 8 Don't buy tropical plants from far north QLD, unless you have a heated glass house.
- 9 Try and go to places like Orchids out West , [I think that it is in May. St Ives is held in August.] They not only have wonderful shows but they have lots of different nurseries to buy from.
- 10 Don't buy seedlings, as they are harder to grow. Instead of buying 3 seedlings I would suggest that you buy one bigger plant. It will have a much better chance of surviving.
- 11 Any seedlings in 50mm/2" pots need to be watered much more often than your bigger plants.
- 12 Always take your new knowledge with some caution, for no other reason than , what happens in your backyard will be way different to what happens in mine as the environment is different in every way.
- 13 a. A species is a plant made by nature and you can tell from the tag as the name will start in lower case.
 - b. A hybrid is man made, by crossing two or more Orchids. The tag on these will start in upper case.
 - c. A mericlone is a plant made from the meristem tissue cut into minute pieces and cultured in a sterile medium in a laboratory, so that they can make many plants quickly.
 - d. An Epiphyte is a plant that grow on branches or trunks of trees well above the ground.
 - e. A Lithophyte is a plant that grows on the rocks, virtually in the absence of soil.
 - f. A keiki is an aerial growth, which is produced randomly on a pseudobulb.

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
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
