

# Warning about watering on hot days

When a very hot day is expected, don't water your orchids after 10am as this may burn the leaves. A misting in between watering is beneficial. Keep the orchid house floor damped down also on hot days. When the weather stays wet and humid for a day or two, spray them thoroughly with Mancazeb which is a fungal spray. NOT Mancazeb Plus. Repeat approximately 7-10 days later. Be diligent also for white scale and look regularly for this pest. Dendrobium beetles are also active at the moment according to some members, catching them when they fall is the best and safest way rather than spraying them with anything toxic. A bit of metho or pest oil in the bottom of a container will kill them before they get a chance to fly out.

As for Cyms' water before 10am (summer and winter for that matter) and don't water on an overcast day, ever. When a spell of hot days is forecast, get the water into them just beforehand. The plants can be overhead watered early evening after a hot day, the theory being that the quick cooling effect initiates flower spikes. As an aside, they don't need to be watered too often! Twice a week at most, unless they're babies and haven't formed their bulbs yet.

As for pests – a bit of mealy bug and/or bois duval creeping back in, grass hoppers, caterpillars, the odd bush rat, and if the humidity remains high an anti-fungal might be a good prophylactic. Ray Clement, Tinonee, uses a strong systemic insecticide and phosphorous acid as an anti-fungal in his nursery, twice a year. Thanks to Liz and Tony for the cym info.
