# ALAN & MIRIAM'S NEWSLETTER

## ALAN'S COLUMN MARCH 2017

By now the seasons seems to be changing. February certainly sent down some rain. Bulb rot became a problem to many growers. The best remedy is to stop watering the plants. If possible keep plants out of the rain and the heat. Once the plants dry out give plants a good <u>soaking</u> with Phos. Acid 600. Don't forget to add some wetting agent to the mix. Do not add an oil such as Eco-Oil® the use of the 600 is better! Apply every six to seven days – drench plus spray This will control most fungal diseases but not all! RHIZOCTONIA can be controlled by the use of TRI-D25. This will also help control *botrytis spp*. You can also use the cut and dry method with the use of calcium hydroxide or sulphur. For the use of this see me. Most of all do not over water. Keep fertilisers down. Plant hormones could be beneficial. Some growers like to apply Condys Crystals as a drench to control bacterial rots such as ERWINIA, PSEUDOMONAS, and O.T.C. Orchid Hygiene Solution which is 12% HYDROGEN PEROXIDE SOLUTION + 16ppm Colloidal Silver Solution at 30ml in 120 litres of water. In the old days you would mix up 3grams of Bi Carb of soda in 3 ml of ECO- OIL This would control all sorts of spot – rots etc.

BANROT 400 WP has proven itself to be the single most effective brood spectrum oil fungicide product in the U.S.A. providing both systemic and contact activity. <u>Provides systemic and contact activity to control root and stem fungi for up to 8 weeks</u>.

Now that the weather has become stabilized, plants are now growing to a programme. Watch the watering. DO NOT OVER WATER. Keep them a little on the dry side. Watch for grubs, use MAVRIK<sup>®</sup>. DIPEL<sup>®</sup> is handy to use but you must know how to use it. When you are going to use it give me a ring for the inside info!

CATTLEYAS: are powering ahead. Growth semi maturing, roots growing well. Last year my catts. Did well top dressing with MERRI COTE. I did not see what the flowering was like, but the growth was good! Watch for scale. Use ECO-OIL or MALATHION. DO NOT APPLY IF THE WEATHER IS HOT.

SOFT CANE DEND: are pushing their new growth along nicely. Fertilise weekly with MERRI FERT or alternate with a good ORGANIC such as SEAWEED SECRETS. Use at 1.0 ml per litre of water. Look for mealy bug and two spotted mites. Water every 3 or 4 days if needed.

AUSTRALIAN NATIVES: Watch what fertilises you use as this could upset this years flowering! Use EXCEL Cal Mag Balanced NPK 15 : 2.2: 7.5 + Ca 5. Use 2 or 3 times between March and July. This is to cut the potash back a little to help prevent root burn. Watch for loopers on the new growths. Top dress with MERRI COTE in March.

MISCELLANEOUS ORCHIDS: Keep plants just damp. Watch for grubs and grasshoppers. Spray with MAVRIK® mixed with ECO-OIL® - NOT ON A HOT DAY/

CYMBIDIUMS: Keep plants just moist. Start to give plant more light. Fertilise weekly with CAMPBELL'S "A" - 11-13-16@ 1 gram per litre of water. Check for Two Spotted Mites under the leaves. Black Spot on leaves ANTI ROT for rotting bulbs. Give plants plenty of light, with out burning the leaves.

We still have plenty of coarse back in stock (DEBCO) at \$20 per bag. MERRI FERT and MERRI COTE in stock to keep plants growing well. Port Pots and various hormones such as AUXINONE<sup>®</sup>

Our famous orchid growing class will be held on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> March at 2pm and the April class will be on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> at 2pm. These classes are held for beginners and for those who want to know what makes our orchids grow (what does NPK mean and what do they do to plants in Summer and Winter? Come along and have fun. Runs for 2 hours 2pm to 4pm then afternoon tea provided by the people who attend we provide tea and coffee etc there are know fees and we have a chin wag to try and solve all of our growing problems.

# **Striking Backbulbs**

Members may remember that I mentioned in the newsletter over a year ago that I had read a tip in the American *Orchids* magazine about striking backbulbs by sitting them in a container of water up to the level that you would expect the new lead to come from. Since then I have done this and must claim a spectacular success rate. Rarely do the backbulbs fail to make a new growth and

some in a very short time. I can vouch for the success rate with the orchids I specialise in, i.e. species cymbidiums and species laelias (some now reclassified as cattleyas), but I have also tried a couple of other genera including epidendrums with success. I'll try some of Brian's odontoglossums and miltoniopsis when he does some repotting.

When I'm repotting I have some clear plastic cups and a waterproof pen handy. When I trim off some backbulbs I put them in a plastic cup with a little water over the base of the pseudobulb and write the name of the plant on the cup. I found the putting labels **in** the cup wasn't such a good idea as they often 'went missing'. These cups sit in a tray under the bench on the south side of the shade house. In the hot weather they needed topping up fairly regularly. I use fresh water but they probably get some run–off when I fertilise the plants above though that is unintentional. A new growth is just starting to show on this *Laelia cinnabarina* (right) which is a backbulb division from October 2016.

Often these extra orchids are surplus to my needs so I usually give the struck divisions, bare-rooted, to Brian to give to newer members at Novices' Corner. Recently I had to pot some up as they were getting good roots and I knew we weren't able to get to the February meeting. I did about 15 plants. At left, from the left, are shoots on *Cym. canaliculatum, Cattleya* (ex *Laelia*) *flava* var. *sulina, Laelia anceps* (5 new shoots) and *Cym. dayanum*. They all had roots starting to show so I potted them into small pots, staked them firmly and will keep them just damp. Most of these backbulbs came from my marathon repotting session in September – October last year so they don't take very long to respond to the' hydroponic' treatment.
