ALAN & MIRIAM MERRIMAN'S NEWSLETTER

ALAN'S COLUMN NOVEMBER 2017 – SUMMER 2018

At last we have finally got away for a short break down to Batemans Bay with our son Colin. Now back to work called Orchid growing. This is maintenance, cleaning up, repotting, spraying feeding etc. It is a good idea to sort out plants that need attention put to one end of the bench those that need weeds pulling out, pull out the weeds and top dress with MERRI COTE around the top rim of all the pots. When you put the prills on the top of the pot – cover the prills over with new mix. DO again in 8 weeks time for a summer spurt of growth. By covering the mix you will not wash the prills off! If

you are using the prills, spray the foliage with MERRI FERT every six weeks. Don't forget the use Magnesium sulphate every four weeks if the weather is very hot. Spray on the foliage to run off. If you have a good wetter add it to the magnesium. Don't use an OIL or cheap wetter.

Watering should be carried out during the early evening to drop the bulb temperature down. This applies mainly to Cymbidiums, remember Cattleya need a day length to encourage flowering! Your cyms may need a little more shade to save from leaf burn. After dividing you could save leaf burn by spreading ENVY over the leaf surface. Watering can be a problem during hot weather. Plants need a good soaking twice a week during hot weather, not in the middle of the day, late afternoon is ideal. In between on very hot days a overhead sprinkle around sunset to cool plants down. In glass houses and poly tunnels the plants will need more misting and less watering. During late Spring and Summer fertilising plants will need some organic as well as their usual feeding programme Remember they like a change in diet SEAWEED SECRETS is a good organic. It has FULVIC ACID added to it. It helps plants combat heat stress during the summer period. It is absorbed through roots and foliage especially in young plants and recently potted plants! The general rate of use is 2 ml mixed in I litre of water. Once mixed it is important to use within four weeks for best results. I know some growers who use seaweed or fish all the year with great results! Remember there is no such thing as the perfect fertiliser. There are too many variables! Growing media, temperature, light, watering etc.

Only change one item at a time if you have a problem with growth and or flowering. First check the pH. of the potting mix before you do anything. This is very important. Try and keep it between poH5.00 and pH 6.0 Remember the older the mix the lower the pH will be. This is why you put some lime and dolomite in the mix. In case you have forgotten the rate, it is one part lime + two parts dolomite by weight. This will give you a ratio of 2:1 Ca to Mg. This will settle down to 4:1 in

around 5 months. Remember this is a top dress to settle the pH down.

CERCOSPORA DENDROBII is raging in all states over the last couple of months. What you can use is an old mixture that has been handed down over the ages from generation to generation! I have heard it can cause leaf drop to soft cane dendrobiums! Try before use! Below is the formula

ZINEB 1.5 gm COPPER OXY 1.5gm

The above is mixed in 1 litre of water. Let mixture stand for three hours, Agitate thoroughly before use. Use a sticker NOT OIL.

Have you had a look at the label of COLIN CAMPBELLS'S ORCHID FERTILISER. The formulation has changed! Have a look at the label of the Yellow. It has a slight change in the trace element content I do not think the plants will tell the difference! Hand up who noticed the difference.
